How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making





School Development Plan – School Goal

Student achievement in literacy will improve.





School Development Plan – Outcomes

 Student achievement in reading and writing will improve through disciplinary literacy.

 Students' sense of belonging at school improves.







School Development Plan – Outcome Measures

- ELA Report Card Indicators
- -writes to develop and organize and express information and ideas
- -reads to explore, construct, and extend understanding
- PAT Gr 6 and 9 Part A and B
- Your outcome reveals that you will work on both reading and writing. Consider adding an RC data set to capture the reading.







School Development Plan – Outcome Measures

Our School Survey

I use word walls and anchor charts to support my learning

Student Perception Data

Student perceptions on AEA Survey ("At school I feel like I belong (I feel like I am part of the school)", "I feel welcome at my school.").

Student response to CBE Student Survey questions: "I feel included at school" "I feel welcome at school"

Student perceptions on Our SCHOOL Survey (Sense of Belonging Summary measure).







School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Increase in words walls and anchor charts visible in classrooms - students will use the academic vocabulary in their written responses, discussion, etc. – teacher observations
- Teacher comfort level with these strategies increases
- Teacher perception data on student use of the word walls and anchor charts
- Consider how you monitor the effectiveness of word walls. Their presence in the classroom doesn't mean students use it or use it effectively. How will you capture this piece?







School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Formative assessment data shows an increase in student understanding of key subject vocabulary
- Consider pre- and post- vocabulary test data to measure their understanding of academic vocabulary throughout the school year
- (Nov, Jan, June) Learning Excellence Actions Well-Being Actions Truth & Reconciliation
- Teacher perception of student engagement in connect time What might be these pre-post measures?





School Development Plan – Actions

Learning Excellence

Teachers will display exemplars in classrooms, highlighting the targeted vocabulary and criteria students need to use to demonstrate understanding

Well-Being

Collaboratively address the identified areas of focus to create welcoming, caring, respectful and safe social and physical spaces (e.g., connect time, & wellness time)

Advertise, encourage and support students to engage in and/or access available clubs, teams and safe spaces throughout the school year.





School Development Plan – Actions

Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion

Assign an area of significance in the school where students can share artifacts, photos, or stories from their backgrounds throughout the year with staff support and guidance.

Professional Learning

Languages Symposium, benchmarking sessions, and language focused new curriculum sessions

Structures & Processes

Collaborative Team Meetings (CRMs) School wide Professional Learning, School Wellness Action Team Activity Day, Connect & Wellness time, Field Trip


